

A Snapshot of Steve Sorensen

Steve Sorensen grew up in rural Pennsylvania and desperately wanted to start hunting with his father when he was six years old, but had to wait six more years (another lifetime in his eyes) before he could carry a rifle in the woods.

Eventually, he became an award-winning outdoor writer and is now a Field Contributor to *Deer and Deer Hunting* magazine. In the last 18 years he has won more than 30 awards from state, regional and national outdoor writer organizations.

His column titled The Everyday Hunter[®] won "Best Newspaper Column" three times. In 2015, 2018, and again in 2023 he won the "Pinnacle Award" from the Professional Outdoor Media Association, the highest honor this national organization gives.

Steve's acute appreciation for rural life, where guns are good and hunting permeates the culture, was sharpened by living in places where he couldn't hunt: Boston, Kansas City, and Washington, D.C. He was educated in various places ranging from a two-room rural schoolhouse to a theological seminary.

Steve is the author of *Growing Up With Guns*, A 30-Day Hunt for Faith, and two other books. He has written for many other magazines, including *Outdoor Life*, *Sports Afield*, *North American Whitetail*, *Bear Hunting Magazine*, *Pennsylvania Game News*, *Game & Fish Magazine*, and more. He has written several books. A new one, The Caretaker Predator, comes out in 2024, and he writes his own blog called "Mission: Hunter." He has designed and manufactures his own very successful turkey call.

Steve speaks frequently at sportsman's dinner ministries and other events from Atlanta, Georgia to Burtts Corner, New Brunswick, and as far west as Billings, Montana.
